GENERAL RULES

("Exhibit" refers to the article or animal. "Exhibitor" refers to the entrant.)

- 1. Entries are open to everyone. Entrants do not need to be residents of Madison County.
- 2. Entry tags must be issued from the Madison County Fair or the exhibit will not be allowed to compete for premiums.
- 3. Management and/or Board of Directors reserves the right to accept entries after closing.
- 4. Management and/or Board of Directors reserves the right to alter classifications and premiums for any recognized breeds of livestock or other exhibits at their discretion.
- 5. Management and/or Board of Directors reserves the right to reject any exhibit if it is objectionable, requires an excessive amount of space, or if the capacity of the department has been reached.
- 6. Attendants at exhibits and concessions must be neatly attired and will be required to conduct themselves in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 7. All pets must be on a leash.
- 8. Dogs or pet animals kept around exhibits or concessions will not be permitted to run at large.
- 9. No persons or exhibitors will be permitted to distribute printed or advertising matter.
- 10. The use of gongs, bells, or other noise instruments for the purpose of attracting attention is prohibited on the fairgrounds.
- 11. Articles entered in the fair in previous years are NOT eligible for entry again.
- 12. Every article entered must be entirely the work of the exhibitor with the exception of quilting on quilts.
- 13. Superintendent retains the right to move an entry into a different class if the original class entered will not have enough entries for competition to exist.

JUDGING RULES

(Prior to judging, each superintendent will inspect all exhibits of his department to determine if they are entered in the class they should compete in. If the superintendent and exhibitor cannot reach an agreement as to the classification- it should be reported to the management. Classification will then be made by a committee appointed by the manager- and that decision will be final.

- 1. No director of this fair shall act as judge in any class, not shall any exhibitor act as a judge in any class.
- 2. If there is any question during the judging as to the regularity of any entry or the right of an exhibitor to compete in any class, the judge shall report immediately to the superintendent of the department for adjustment.
- 3. Awards will be made according to the merits of the exhibit.
- 4. The judge may disqualify or award second or third premiums at his discretion.
- 5. Anyone attempting to influence the judges, in any manner will forfeit all awards and be excluded for all competition and exhibition.
- 6. No one will be permitted in the Home Arts Building during judging except the Awards Committee, the Officers of the Fair, and the necessary attendants.
- 7. The judges will be expected, if called upon, to give reasons for the decision, embracing the value and desirable qualities of the animals or articles to which the awards were made.
- 8. All protests must be made in writing, setting forth grounds for protest.
- 9. Judges decisions are final.

ANIMAL RULES

- 1. No diseased or inferior stock or articles will be assigned space on the fairgrounds for exhibition.
- 2. Exhibitors must in all cases be the bona fide owners of the animals or articles exhibited by them, except where otherwise specified.
- 3. A transfer of ownership for the purposes of exhibiting will debar any animal or article and operate against the awarding of premiums offered by the Madison County Fair.
- 4. Trucks and trailers must be parked in the space designated by the General Livestock Superintendent and cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock buildings.
- 5. No animal or article may compete in more than one class or for more than one trophy, except as one pair, group, or championship. (Special rules and exceptions may apply for each department.)

EXHIBITOR RULES

- 1. All exhibits must be in place as specified in the general rules of each department.
- 2. No exhibits will be released before MONDAY, AUGUST 21st at 9 AM.
- 3. Exhibitors having space assigned to them will not be permitted to change to another location without having obtained permission from the superintendent of the department under penalty of the forfeiture of premiums.
- 4. Articles sent by mail, freight, or express must be prepared.
- 5. No exhibit will be accepted if carrier charges have not been paid.
- 6. Exhibits entered in the fair in previous years are *not* eligible for entry again.
- 7. Exhibitors may make up to 5 entries in each class as desired unless otherwise specified by department. Some departments will only allow less.
- 8. No exhibitor will be allowed more than two (2) premiums in any one class.
- 9. Exhibitors making entries and not exhibiting shall forfeit all entry fees.
- 10. Ample light is furnished in all buildings. If additional light or power is required, all wiring and power must be furnished by the consumer and wired under supervision of the fair electrician. Any cost for additional light and power will be paid by the exhibitor.
- 11. Exhibits winning premiums in the 4-H Club Crop Projects of Future Farmers Crop Division shall not be eligible for entry in the open class,
- 12. Sales of exhibits may be made for delivery at the close of the fair.
- 13. No exhibit may be removed before the closing day of the fair unless directed by department superintendents.
- 14. If exhibits are removed from exhibit prior to pick up day and time, premium(s) forfeited.
- 15. Any exhibit not picked up from the Home Arts, Photography, Fine Arts, and Horticulture at closing will become property of the Madison County Fair and will be disposed.

PREMIUM RULES

- 1. For premiums to be awarded a competition must exist.
- 2. Competition is a contest of supremacy between 2 (two) or more animals, projects, or articles owned by separate exhibitors.
- 3. Two exhibits entered by the same person OR household does not constitute a competition.
- 4. When a community interest in the ownership of animals or article is apparent in the judgement of the Board, competition will be considered to not exist although the actual ownership might be separate.
- 5. The Madison County Fair will not award a premium on any articles not specifically mentioned in the Premium List. Such articles may be accepted by the superintendent of the department of the exhibition.
- 6. The Judges' books shall be evidence of payment of premiums. Ribbons and cards are not accepted.
- 7. If found that a premium has been obtained by false evidence, misrepresentation, or a violation of the general (or special) rules governing the department, all premiums will be withheld.
- 8. Once entrants have collected and signed out entries and premium envelopes, Madison County is not responsible for lost, stolen, or unclaimed premium.
- 9. All premiums must be claimed within 30 days of the fair.
- 10. Any premium not picked up on **AUGUST 21, 2023** will be available at the County Clerk's Office for 30 days. After 30 days, all premiums and prizes are considered forfeited and will be returned to the Madison County Fair Operations costs.

LIABILITY

- 1. The Madison County Fair will not be responsible for any loss or damage caused by strikes, riots, lockouts, or acts of God.
- 2. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any consequential loss, or damage done to, occasioned by, or arising from any animal or articles exhibited by them. Those shall indemnify the Madison County Fair against all legal proceedings in regard thereto.
- 3. The Madison County Fair will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of exhibits and property of every description entered for competition, display, or any other purpose while anywhere on the grounds that shall be subject to the control of the Madison County Fair.
- 4. The owners, themselves, must take the risk of exhibiting.
- 5. The Madison County Fair will in no case be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury of any property, article, animal, or person while the same are on the fairgrounds or any other time or place or be liable for any payment for damage, loss, or injury. Presentation of articles or animals for exhibition and entrance upon said grounds shall be deemed acceptance of the rule.
- 6. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits are liable to occasional accidents, injury, or damage to persons coming in contact therewith.
- 7. Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Madison County Fair from and against all such claims and demands, costs, charges, and expenses which it may incur, suffer, or be put to, by reason of any exhibit not properly guarded therefrom. Presentation of entry or agreement or verbal or written concession shall be deemed acceptance of the rule.
- 8. Any exhibit not picked up on **AUGUST 21, 2023** will be available at the County Clerk's Office for 30 days. After 30 days, all exhibits are considered forfeited.

The Madison County Fair does not carry insurance for theft or damage to personal property while it is on the fairgrounds and therefore does not assume any liability for same. While the fair personnel will exercise all reasonable precautions, any property displayed is done so at the owner's risk. Personal property is generally covered by one's homeowner's policy. Any additional insurance coverage must be obtained by the exhibitor.

HOME ARTS AWARDS

All entries are judged and awarded blue (1st), red (2nd), or White (3rd) flat ribbons on quality. In *addition*, each Division may have a winner awarded:

1st Place: Blue Rosette \$10 2nd Place: Red Rosette \$7 3rd Place: White Rosette \$5

1st PLACE: Trophy Champion Rosette and \$25 award 2nd PLACE: Grand Champion Rosette and \$15 award

3rd PLACE: Reserve Grand Champion Rosette and \$10 award

An overall People's Choice Award of \$25 (and rosette!) will be given in Photography and Fine Arts, Quilts, Home Arts (which included all other divisions), and Horticulture. Kids' Corner will award a People's Choice Rosette accompanied with a prize.

- 1. Participants select a used fashion, home, or other post-consumer item to recycle into a new product.
- 2. Participants must create a brand-new product. Not simply embellish an old one.
- 3. Designs must exhibit effective form and function.

DIVISION 7: CERAMICS

Special Rules for Division 7:

A ceramic is any of the various hard, brittle, heat-resistant, and corrosion-resistant materials made by shaping and then firing an inorganic, nonmetallic material, such as clay, at the high temperature. Common examples are earthenware, porcelain, and brick.

DIVISION 8: ANTIQUES

Special Rules for Division 8:

- 1. Antiques must be at least 50 years old and will be judged according to age, condition, and original appearance and form.
- 2. Entries should be washed, clean, and presentable.
- 3. Jewelry and small items must be mounted on a 3"x3" cardboard.
- 4. No damaged or chipped items will be accepted. (Exceptions made at Superintendent's discretion.)
- 5. Collection must have 6 (six) individual items of the same function, not matching, and well displayed. Some exceptions may apply.
- 6. Examples: Books, collections, clothing, farming tools, furniture, glassware, guns and ammunition, household items, Indian artifacts, pottery, refinished furniture, and toys.
- 7. Anyone receiving Champion Award may not re-enter the same exhibit for 5 years.

DIVISION 9: BAKED GOODS

Classes:

Please Note: Decorated cakes are not tasted, so you can use fake layers. Cake Decorating is judged on color, originality, and intricacy of design. The entire cake must be presented for judging and must stay for the entire Fair.

Special Rules for Division 9

- 1. Recipe must be included on a 3x5 card.
- 2. All entries must be covered in plastic wrap.

Display Rules for Division 9 by Class

- 1. Pies- The entire pie must be presented for judging. Following judging, only one piece must be left for display.
- 2. Candies- Four (4) pieces on a plate must be presented for judging. In addition, one piece in a bag needs to be presented for judges to sample.
- 3. Cakes- The entire cake must be presented for judging. Following judging, only one piece must be left for display.
- 4. Bread- The entire loaf must be presented for judging. Four (4) pieces or slices need to be presented on a plate or in a bag for the judges to sample.
- 5. Cookies- Four (4) pieces on a plate must be presented for judging. In addition, one piece in a bag needs to be presented for judges to sample.

DIVISION 10: CANNING

- 6. Jellies (Paraffin seals are not recommended by the USDA)
- 7. Jams
- 8. Preserves (Preserves are fruit which the tissues of the fruit have absorbed heavy syrup until they are filled with syrup instead of water and are whole or large pieces.)
- 9. Marmalades (Marmalades are made from fruits which have some jelly making properties. Sliced oranges or lemons may be added.)
- 10. Conserves (Conserves differ from marmalades in that several fruits may be combined and nuts may be added.)
- 11. Pickles and Relishes
- 12. Freeze Dried

Special Rules:

- 1. Must include product name and processing method (water bath or pressure) on entry tag or on a 3x5 card. Entries without this with not awarded a premium.
- 2. Headspace in jars must be ¼ inch for jam, jellies, and juices.
- 3. Headspace in jars must be $\frac{1}{2}$ inch for fruits, pickles, salsa, sauces, and tomatoes.
- 4. Jars should have new rings.
- 5. Jars must be standard canning jars.
- 6. Judging will be done on safety, container, pack, and appearance.
- 7. No freezer jams will be accepted.
- 8. For jams, jellies, preserves, marmalades, and conserves entries, 2 jars must be provided. One will be used for judging the canning process and one will be for tasting.

Display Rules for Division 10 by Class:

- 1. Dried Fruits- Provide ½ cup.
- 2. Dried Vegetables- Provide ½ cup.
- 3. Specialties must be in jars.

DIVISION 11: KIDS CORNER

Exhibitor must be under the age of 16 as of January 1 of the current year. Only 3 entries per person per class will be allowed.

Special Rules for Division 11

- 1. Artwork and photography must be mounted on a hard backing like foam board, mat board, or poster board.
- 2. No mounting supplies will be at the fair.
- 3. Legos with many/multiple must be secured to a base or displayed in a cardboard box. NO LEGO KITS will be accepted for judging. It can be entered but will not be eligible for premiums.
- 4. Drawing and Painting will be judged by age group. (2-6, 7-11, 12-16)

Award Rules for Division 11

All entries will receive \$1 (limit \$5)

All entries will be judged and awarded Blue, Red, or White ribbon on quality.

If exhibitor wins a Division Rosette the \$1 premium will not be given.

Each class will be judged and awarded 3 Class Rosettes.

1st Place: Rosette Ribbon and \$10 award.

2nd Place: Rosette Ribbon and \$7 award.

3rd Place: Rosette Ribbon and \$5 award.

- 2. All youth entries must meet the same requirements as the regular entries in the Agriculture and Horticulture.

3. Youth premiums are 1st place: \$10, 2nd place: \$7, and 3rd place: \$5

DIVISION 5: FARM RAISED CHICKEN EGGS

Display Rules for Horticulture and Agriculture

All items are to be on a disposable plate.

Apples: 4 with stems on.
Apricots: 4 with stems on.
Asparagus: 4 stalks, top 6"
Beans: 8 pods with stems on
Beets: 4 with 1" top and tail
Berries: 8 with stems on

Broccoli: 1 head with 2"-4" stem

Brussel Sprouts: 4 each

Cabbage: 1 head, cut close to bottom

Cantaloupe: 1cut from end to end and covered with clear plastic wrap

Carrots: 4 with 1" top and tail

Cauliflower: 1 head cut close to bottom

Celery: 2 stalks with root on Chard: 4 petioles with blades Cherries: 8 with stems on

Corn Cobs: Remove husks and silks. Leave tip and 1" stem

Cucumbers: 4 with stems on Eggplant: 2 with stems on

Grapes: 2 clusters

Jerusalem Artichokes: 4 each

Kale: 3 leaves with stem Leeks: 4 with root on

Lettuce: 2 heads or bunches, cut close to bottom

Melons: 1 with stem on Onions: 4 with roots on Parsnips: 4 with top on Peas: 8 pods with stems Peppers: 4 with stems

Plums/Prunes: 8 with stems

Potatoes: 4 each

Pumpkins: 1 with stem
Radish: 4 leaves and tail on

Radish. 4 leaves and latt on

Rhubarb: 4 stalks with blades removed

Spinach: 4 petioles with blades

Squash: 1 winter or summer with stem

Tomatoes: 4 with stem

Turnips: 4 with 1" top and tails on

Egg entries need to be 6 clean eggs marked with breed of chicken.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND FINE ARTS

AWARDS

All entries are judged and awarded blue (1st), red (2nd), or White (3rd) FLAT ribbons on quality. In addition, each Division is may have a winner awarded:

1st PLACE: Blue Rosette \$10

2nd PLACE: Red Rosette \$7

3rd PLACE: White Rosette \$5

1st PLACE: Trophy Champion Rosette and \$25 awards 2nd PLACE: Grand Champion Rosette and \$15 awards 3nd PLACE: Reserve Grand Champion Rosette and \$10 award

Special Rules:

- 1. All artwork and photographs must be ready to be hung in the exhibit at time of entry.
- 2. Entries must be mounted with two sided Velcro adhered to the back. Velcro and mounting supplies will not be available at the Fairgrounds.
- 3. No entries can be framed. (Other than Professional entries.)
- 4. No names, watermarks, or logos can be visible on the exhibit.
- 5. No nudity or suggestive nudity that would not be appropriate for all ages to view.
- 6. Work must be original and can only be submitted one year.
- 7. Professionals have a \$25 fee with a limit of 3 entries.
- 8. Advanced and Amateur entries have no fee with a limit of 5 entries.

DIVISION 1: PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHY

PROFESSIONAL:

- 1. Defined as anyone who is currently charging or has charged fees for providing photography services of any kind, has photography in a gallery for sale, and/or teaches photography for fees.
- 2. Entries can be no larger than 16x24 when framed. No mats will be permitted.
- 3. Business cards may be displayed by the entry after judging.
- 4. Grand Champion Winner is awarded \$50 or the total sum of all entry fees for Professional Photography Division. Which is larger!
- 5. Metal prints and gallery wraps must be framed or will not be accepted.

DIVISION 2: PHOTOGRAPHY

Classes:

- 1. Advanced Adult
- 2. Amateur/Beginner

Special Rules per Class:

ADVANCED ADULT:

- 1. Defined as an experienced member of a camera club, a photographer with formal photography education, or an experienced photographer who does not sell their photography.
- 2. Entries cannot be framed.
- 3. All entries must be 11x14 or 11x16 and mounted on a hardback material such as foam core board. Posterboard and cardboard will not be accepted.
- 4. All entries must be prepared to be displayed with Velcro adhesive along the top of your piece within 1" of the edge of the exhibit.
- 5. Cardboard, posterboard, wood, glass, plastic, or Formica are not permitted for matting.
- 6. Items must be flush mounted (edge to edge).
- 7. Prints that fall off due to poor mounting will not be repaired, may not be judged ad will be removed from the exhibit. Double stick tape is not considered a mount and will not be accepted.
- 8. No canvas wraps are accepted.

AMATEUR:

- 1. Defined as new to photography, has little experience in photography, and little knowledge or photography training.
- 2. Entries can be no larger than 8x10.
- 3. Cardboard, posterboard, wood, glass, plastic, or Formica are not permitted for matting.
- 4. Items must be flush mounted (edge to edge).
- 5. Prints that fall off due to poor mounting will not be repaired, may not be judged ad will be removed from the exhibit. Double stick tape is not considered a mount and will not be accepted.

6. No canvas wraps are accepted.

Traditional paintings and drawings are included in Fine Arts.

Age in each class as of January 1st of that current year.

No more than 5 entries can be made in the entire division.

Special Rules for Division

- 1. Poultry must be dusted for lice and mites 1 week before showing.
- 2. Exhibitors must complete a cage tag for each animal along with an entry form. Forms will be available at check in.
- 3. Animals must be health checked prior to caging.
- 4. Transport cages should be taken home during the fair.
- 5. Exhibitors are responsible for their own food for their animal.
- 6. Animals must be fed and watered twice a day.
- 7. Only exhibitors are allowed behind the cages.
- 8. Exhibitors need to place signs on cages prohibiting the sale of the animals.
- 9. All animals must be assigned cages 30 minutes prior to judging.
- 10. All animals (including 4-H) will be judged for quality in open class.
- 11. Awards will be on cages by 8 AM the following morning after judging.
- 12. No animals can be picked up prior to "Pick Up Time" on Saturday.
- 13. Any exhibitor bringing in Waterfowl or Family Flock need to notify the superintendent 1 week before the fair so cages can be arranged.

Awards for Open Class:

Blue: Outstanding Quality

Red: Good Quality

White: Satisfactory Quality
